DISCIPLINARY RULES

A. Time Schedule:

Students should reach the campus and their respective classes on prescribed time. Untime entry and exit of the students in and out of the campus is restricted. Main gate will remain closed from 10.15 AM to 12.50 P.M. and from 2.00PM to 3.40 PM. Students should obtain out pass from HODs for going outside during these timings. Late comers register will be maintained with Security Office. After the prescribed time no students is allowed to remain in the campus.

B. Identity cards Compulsory:

All students admitted to the college should compulsorily wear their Identity Cards whenever they are present on the college campus. All payments, issue of certificates, mark lists etc., will be made only on production of the Identity Card. The Identity card shall be surrendered to the office at the time of claiming the refund of caution deposit or issuing of Transfer Certificate/Qualifying Certificate, whichever is earlier.

C. Mobile Phones Banned:

The use of mobile phone is strictly prohibited in the college campus as per Government order. Offenders will be levied with fine and the mobile phone will be confiscated. The use of mobile phones and smart watches is strictly prohibited in the campus. The seized phones will be withheld under the custody of the concerned heads of the Departments and will be returned after one month on the payment of Rs.500 as fine.

D. Uninformed leave and Lack of Proper Uniform:

The leaves uninformed, lack of proper uniform and ID card will be charged Rs.200 as fine. Late or absence for three hours will be treated as a one-day leave.

E. Consequences and Procedures for suspended students:

The students who have faced disciplinary action or suspension should go through following consequences and procedures:

- a) The suspended students should never enter the campus during the period of their suspension under at any circumstance.
- b) They will be removed from all the official portfolios in the Campus and Hostel.
- c)Their membership in any college team (Arts /Sports) will be cancelled.
- d)They should submit declaration /undertaking/apology letter in their own handwritten from along with the signature of parent.
- e) For revoking suspension, they should pay an amount of Rs.2000/-

F. Public and Official Programmes:

- a) Students should compulsorily attend all the public and official programmes of the College. Failure of which will be charges of Rs.200 as fine.
- b) Entertainment program by external agencies/ professional groups/ paid programs such as DJ music events will not be permitted inside the campus. No type of fund raising from students shall be permitted, as students' program in this regard, which may be organized with prior permission from authorities.

G. Mandatory Dress Code:

Students should wear uniform on prescribed days & exam time. Students should wear decent dress, preferably saree or Churidar by girl students and pants and shirt by boys. Transparent clothes, T-Shirts with colour prints, and caps are to be avoided on Wednesdays.

H. Outsiders not permitted:

Outsiders are not permitted to meet any of the staff or students on the college campus without the permission of the Principal.

Students shall not bring any outsiders except the parent/guardian to the college premises for any purpose whatsoever without the permission of the Principal.

I. Character and conduct.

- Conduct Certificate will not be issued as a matter of course. It has to be earned by the student's good conduct and behavior. The decision of the Principal shall be final regarding this matter.
- 2. Students shall greet both teaching and nonteaching staff on the occasion of their first meeting them during the day.
- 3. When the Principal or teacher enters a classroom, students shall stand greet and keep standing till they are asked to sit down.
- Students should be seated in their respective class rooms before the teaching hour commences.
- 5. Students should be seated in their respective class rooms by 9.40 A.M. and should not leave the classes except during intervals.
- 6. When a student wants to enter or leave the class room while the class is on he/she shall do so only after getting the permission of the teacher.
- 7. During the absence of the teacher and while moving from one class to another, students are expected to keep silence.
- 8. Students shall not loiter on the verandahs or college premises during working hours for any reasons whatsoever.
- 9. Students are advised to use the library during free periods.
- 10. Students shall not enter any class other than their own.
- 11. No indecent representation shall be made by any student towards any other student in words, letters, gestures or by any other means.

J. Attendance and Leave:

- 1. Students should be regular and punctual in attending classes.
- 2. Attendance will be marked at the beginning of each hour by the teacher engaging the class.
- 3. If one teaching hour is missed it is equal to missing half a days attendance.
- 4. Students who do not have at least 75% of attendance are not eligible to appear for university examinations.
- A student abstaining from classes without proper acknowledgment of leave for more than fourteen consecutive working days will have his/her name removed from the rolls.
- 6. Leaving the campus after marking the attendance on any hour will be treated as a serious act of indiscipline.

- Application for leave of absence should be submitted in the prescribed form to the Principal through the Tutor concerned. Bona fide applications will be positively considered subject to University regulations.
- 8. Applying for leave of absence does not imply that the leave will be granted.
- Application for condonation of shortage of attendance may be forwarded to the University only if the absence is on medical ground and necessary Medical Certificate is attached.
- 10. In the case of medical leave, Medical Certificate should be submitted along with the application for leave or soon after the medical treatment is over.
- 11. Students who could not attend classes on account of their participation in YRC/NSS activities, sports and games, university arts festivals, seminars, workshops and such other extracurricular activities within or outside the campus may submit an application for leave to the Principal, though proper channel. Bonafide applications will be positively considered subject to University regulations.
- 12. No student is expected to approach the Principal or the Principals office in person for enquiry on attendance. In case of any doubts or grievances, they may approach the Head of the Department.

K. Political Activities Banned:

Political activities are strictly prohibited on the college campus. Violation of which will result in stringent action including dismissal without prior warning.

L. Ragging: A Serious Criminal Offence:

Student shall not indulge in ragging or in any other activities causing harassment or difficulties to the fellow students in the college. Any student involving in ragging activities will have to face penal proceedings in accordance with the provisions in the Ragging Prohibition Act.1997 of the Government of Tamilnadu.

M. Other Rules & Regulations:

- Smoking and consumption of alcoholic beverages are strictly prohibited on the campus. Students shall not use or bring tobacco or its products, intoxicating drinks or narcotic substances to the college.
- 2. Students shall not go on tour, picnic or excursion without the written permission of the Principal.
- Prior written permission of the Principal is necessary for organizing processions, meetings, entertainment programs & functions in the college: for collecting funds from the students/staff: and for distributing notice or putting up any notice on the notice board.
- 4. Students shall not cause any loss or damage to the college property. International causing of loss or damage will be considered a serious misconduct. The offenders will be proceeded against for the same and will be liable for recovery or the loss. Unintentional causing of loss or damage will result in the recovery of loss or damages from the offenders.
- 5. Student shall not write or make any marks on the walls or any part of the college property. If found guilty they are liable to be punished and the expenses for the repair work will be recovered from the offenders.
- 6. Cinematic dances and fashion shows are not permitted on the campus.
- 7. Congregating at the entrance of the college gate and sitting on the portico and the steps of the staircase are to be avoided.
- 8. Students are free to follow any religion of their choice.
- 9. A student who has any complaint against any other students, teaching g staff or nonteaching staff shall represent the same either in writing or orally to the Tutor, HOD, Discipline Committee or to the Principal directly. Such representations can be made by the parents/Guardian of the students also.

N. Misconduct and Disciplinary Actions:

 Students are bound to obey the directions, issued from time to time, by the Principal, Teachers and the authorities. Disobedience to such directions would amount to serious misconduct.

- Any student, who is found to have conducted himself/herself in any indecent or disorderly manner inside or outside the class room in the college premises, is liable to be proceeded against for the said misconduct.
- A teacher may send a student out of the class if the student misbehaves in the class. If any student is sent out of the class, the teacher and the student shall report the matter to the Principal.
- 4. The Principal shall have the power to inflict the following punishments upon the offenders: fine, cancellation of attendance, withholding the term certificate, forfeiting education concession and scholarship, suspension, compulsory issue of T.C. without the application from the student or guardian, and expulsion.

EXAMINATION

Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA)

1. CIA Theory Examination

Every semester, two centralized Internal Examination and one model Examinations for each paper are conducted. Each paper carries maximum marks of 75 or its equivalent percentage as maximum marks. The sum of marks obtained in the examinations (Best of one Internal Exam and Model Exam) are divided in accordance with the marks for examination component of CIA of a paper.

3. Marks for Attendance (Common for both Theory and Practical)

Every student should earn a minimum attendance of 75% to become eligible to appear for End-of-Semester Examinations. The 5 marks allotted to this component under CIA of theory and practical will be awarded as given below.

4. CIA Practical Examination

CIA marks for Practical are awarded based on the performance of students in CIA practical exam and observation notebook, regularity and attendance. For each practical, student should write one model practical exam.

End of Semester Examinations (ESE)

A semester consists of a minimum of 90 teaching days. Passing minimum to each subject/ course under UG programme is 40% in ESE and 40% in aggregate, i.e,. CIA + ESE. . Passing minimum to each subject/ course under PG programme is 50% in ESE and 50% in aggregate, i.e,. CIA + ESE.

Examinations and Pattern of Evaluation

End-of-Semester Theory Examinations for Core/ Allied/ Elective / Skill Based Subjects are held in November and April of every academic year for odd and even semesters respectively. Project / Practical Examinations are conducted prior to the theory examinations. Time-table for examinations is displayed well in advance and Hall Tickets are issued to the students who are eligible.

Issue of hall ticket

For the receipt of hall ticket, students should submit No-Due Form, to the department concerned they should clear all the dues related to various fees, library books, class assignments or seminars

Bharathiar University School of Distance Education Centre

Besides regular courses, Nilgiri College serves as the study centre and examination centre of Bharathiar University School of Distance Education with Centre Code of TN1412. The examinations of distance courses will be held in May/June of every year.
